


Whether the Weather from Space in 2025



This year Europe launched the next generation of meteorological satellites: MTG (Meteosat Third Generation) and MetOp-SG (Meteorological Operational Satellite - Second Generation), a joint endeavour between the Eumetsat (European Meteorological Organisation) and ESA (European Space Agency) at a cost of ~8Billion Euros. This could not be more timely given the unfolding climate crisis.

Janet Charlton, who was part of the Filton BAe Space Systems team as a Systems Engineer and Project Manager, will trace the origins of space based observations for meteorology and review activities in this field up to the present day. She will also highlight Bristol's contribution to past and present missions.
